

Berrien County 5th Year Early/Middle College

Get a head start on college and in life by earning college credit or a certificate for FREE, while you're still in high school through the Berrien County 5th Year Early/ Middle College program. Tuition, books, and fees are provided at no cost to students and families.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Basically, you will earn substantial college credit up to an associate degree. Students take some college classes during 11th and 12th grades, and then attend college full time during "grade 13," or a 5th year of high school to complete the program.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

1. Save a ton of money. The national average cost of attending a four-year public college is about \$42,000 per year. By starting college while in high school, you could cut your college costs in half.
2. Get a head start on your career. Whether you earn a career certificate or an associate Degree, you will advance through your educational path and start your career faster than a traditional educational program.
3. Transition smoothly to four-year colleges. Lake Michigan College (LMC) and Southwestern Michigan College (SMC) participate in the state-wide Michigan Transfer Agreement and has individual transfer agreements with universities throughout Michigan and Indiana.

THIS SOUNDS LIKE A SIGNIFICANT COMMITMENT

Students who elect to enroll in the Berrien County 5th Year Early/Middle College commit to:

- attending a mandatory week long Summer College Success Bootcamp during summer vacation between 10th and 11th grade.
- successfully complete college course work in their junior and senior years of high school.
- extending their high school graduation date by one school year. Students will however participate in commencement with their original graduating class.
- will graduate from high school with a high school diploma plus significant college credits, or a career certificate, or an associate degree or a MEMCA Certificate.

The Berrien County Early/Middle College program is a partnership between Berrien RESA, Lake Michigan College and Southwestern Michigan College. Availability of the above programs and certificates will depend on student enrollment.
